



## Albert Taylor Stultz

May 9, 1936 - December 3, 2023

Albert Taylor Stultz, 87, of Butler, Pennsylvania died peacefully in his home on December 3, 2023 surrounded by friends and family.

He was born in McKees Rocks, Pennsylvania on May 9, 1936 to William W. and Elsie Elizabeth (Taylor) Stultz. He was the fourth of five children.
