Charles "Chuck" Carl Kay, 78, of Butler, passed away Tuesday, September 19, 2017 at Butler Memorial Hospital.

He was born November 20, 1938 in Harrisville, the son of the late Francis Stevenson and Eva Blanch (Buchanan) Kay.

Chuck was a veteran of the US Marines, US Army, and retired from the US Air Force after 22 years. He subsequently retired from General Electric after 20 years. He attended Unionville Evangelical Presbyterian Church. Chuck belonged to the Masonic Lodge #272 Free & Accepted Masons and the Unionville Grange.
