



## Clarence "Ed" E. Davis

Clarence "Ed" E. Davis, 88, of Butler, PA, passed away Thursday, October 13, 2011 at VNA Inpatient Hospice.

He was born May 15, 1923 in Sligo, PA, the son of the late Samuel James and Alice (Vogel) Davis.

Ed was a member of the Oak Hills Christian Church where he was an Elder Emeritus. He graduated from Cranberry High School in Venango Co., Slippery Rock Teachers College and received his master's degree from Pitt University. He taught school for 32 years between Lyndora and Butler Jr. High. Ed was a member of New Castle Consistory and a 32nd degree Mason from Wm. H. Miller Lodge 769. He was a veteran of the US Army Air Corps., a member of Am. Legion in Prospect, Consistory Legion of Honor and a lifetime member of the PA Association of School Retirees.

Surviving are his wife, Virginia Repine-Davis; 2 step-daughters, Mrs. Darryl (Paula) Kearns of Butler and Mrs. Michael (Janice) Arnold of Pawleys Island, SC; 3 step grandchildren; and a number of nieces and nephews and great nieces and nephews.
