Edith Irene Oesterling, 93, formerly of Butler, passed away Saturday, September 4, 2021 at in Clinton, Tennessee.

She was born April 27, 1928 in Butler County, the daughter of the late Albert George and Helen (Lowry) Protzman. She married Keith LaVerne Oesterling on September 11, 1946.

Edith belonged to the Spirit of Grace Church in Hudson, Florida and St. John's Lutheran Church in Connoquenessing. Edith was an Auditor for Jefferson Township and a Census Taker. The various clubs she belonged to were the Buco Trailer Club, Eastern Star, and 500 Card Club. She was a lifetime member and leader of the Girl Scouts. 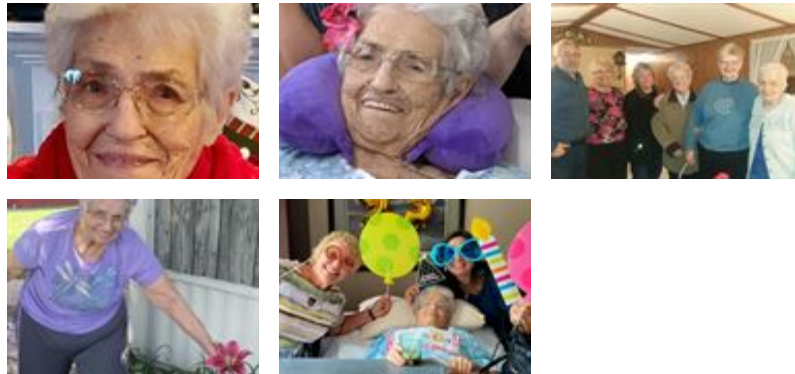
