Geraldine M. Hull, passed away on May 1, 2016 in Arizona. Gerry was one of the saints of the Earth. She loved and cared for all, both 2-footed and 4-footed. She was kind, gentle and unfailingly considerate. She was the ultimate nurse, caregiver, friend and sister.

She was born in Pittsburgh, PA to the late Eleanor M. (Kane) and William H Nedde. She moved to Monaca, PA when her father was transferred by Westinghouse Electric from Pittsburgh to Beaver, PA. She graduated from Hopewell High School, Sewickley Valley Hospital School of Nursing, and the University of Pittsburgh. She worked at Sewickley Valley Hospital and LaJolla, CA, Scripps Hospital before her 30-year career at the Butler Veterans Administration Hospital, Butler, PA from which she retired in 1992.

In addition to her career in nursing, Gerry also volunteered with the Butler County Humane Society and the Butler County Mental Health Association.

She was active in Hill Presbyterian Church and served as a Deacon.

She lived in Butler from 1964 until 2008 when she moved to Fountain Hills, AZ to be close to her sister Chris Young and her family. She battled breast cancer for many years before succumbing to the disease.

She is survived by her younger sister Christine Nedde Young of Fountain Hills, AZ and her younger brother Norman R Nedde, M.D. of Fort Mill, SC. She is also survived by many nieces and nephews. Two of her brothers, Nelson Nedde and William Nedde, Jr. preceded her in death.
