Harry Sewanich, 91, of Lyndora, PA , died at 10:12 PM on Sunday, December 3, 2006 at Sunnyview Home.

He was born Friday, October 1, 1915 in Lyndora, PA. He was the son of the late John Sewanich, Sr. and the late Josephine (Lubon) Sewanich.

He was a member of U S Army serving during WW II. He served in Company K, 16th Infantry, 1st division. He was wounded twice in North Africa and received the Purple Heart, Combat Infantry Badge, a Bronze Star, the European African Campaign Medal with 2 bronze stars, the American defense and good conduct medal. He belonged to the American Legion Post 778 and the 16th Infantry regiment Association. He was a member of the Civilian Conservation Corp. He belonged to St. Peter and St. Paul Ukrainian Orthodox Church. He enjoyed gardening and repairing small engines.

He worked in the Maintenance Dept. for Black & Decker Air Tool in Ohio.

Surviving are 2 Sisters, Helen Sewanich of Lyndora, Julia Pichler of Lyndora; Brother, Joseph Sewanich of Butler; and several nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by 3 sisters and 3 brothers.
