Herbie showed us how to scale the fence at night so we would have our own 60' x 200' pool for moon light swimming. As I was becoming a teenager Herb was off to the service and as we became young men married and saw little of one another. Best times together were when the 3 brothers,(Rick,Herb,Jerry) and Dad went on fishing trips together or simply to play horse shoes. Always the oldest against the youngest. I know we would all agree our last trip together in Canada was our best time together.

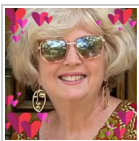
