



## Leonard J. Dollar

October 19, 1930 - May 14, 2011

Leonard J. Dollar, 80, of Butler, Center Township died May 14, 2011 at the VNA Inpatient Hospice in Butler.

Born October 19, 1930 in Butler Township, he was the son of the late Frank and Anne Mrochek Dollar. He attended Butler High School and enlisted in the US Navy in 1948. During the Korean War he served with VM06, a Marine helicopter squadron, as a mechanic and was later transferred to the USS Missouri's helicopter crew.

After discharge in 1952 he worked for Armco for a short time before taking a position with Spartan Aircraft Co. in Fort Sill, OK where he worked as a crew chief in the helicopter division for three years. He returned to Butler in 1955 and worked at Armco Steel in the Rigger Shop for the next 35 years until his retirement in 1990.

He played baseball for many years around the Butler area and while he was in the Navy. He was an avid sports fan and follower of the Pirates, Steelers and University of Notre Dame.

He also enjoyed hunting and fishing in his younger years.

He was a member of St. Paul Roman Catholic Church of Butler and a life long

member of VFW Post 249.

He was married to Ruth I. Henry for 47 years until her death in July of 2000. They are the proud parents of three children, Gary (Susan) Dollar of Billerica, Mass who spent 20 years in the US Army, Kathleen (William) Wise of Boiling Springs, PA, and Terry (Michele) Dollar of Carmel Indiana; seven grandchildren, Aaron Dollar of New Haven, Conn and Andrea Dixon of Bolton Mass, Amanda and Christopher Dollar of Bloomington Indiana, and Stephanie, Nicole and Tyler Wise of Boiling Springs, PA; and two great-grandsons, Joshua and Ryan Dixon of Bolton, Mass. Also surviving are a brother, Edward Dollar and his wife Jean of Fairport Harbor, OH, and a very special niece, Jeanne Potter of Slippery Rock as well as a number of other nieces and nephews and cousins. He is preceded in death by a sister, Christine Kaltenbach in 2007.
