Nina Elizabeth (Turnblacer) Dillon, 88, of Butler died gently, in the loving care of her family, on November 13, 2010 at her home.

Born in Crafton, Pennsylvania, she was the daughter of Frederick F. and Gertrude L. (Joyce) Turnblacer.

She was a graduate of Butler High School, and the Butler Hospital School of Nursing. She also did course work at the University of Pittsburgh.

She worked as a surgical nurse at Butler Hospital and an office nurse for her brother, the late Charles B. She was a loving mother, grandmother and great-grandmother. Her greatest delights were family gatherings to celebrate birthdays, anniversaries, holidays or other occasions throughout the year.

She was preceded in death by her husband of sixty years, Attorney Charles E. Dillon. She is survived by seven children, Ann Dillon of Austin, Texas, Charles E. Dillon, Jr. (Carol A. Tokar) of Butler, Robert D. Dillon (Angela E.) of Benbrook Texas, Patricia J. Birckbichler (Jeffrey) of Butler, Daniel F. Dillon (Dr. Mary Catherine) of Cranberry Township, Elizabeth J. Catalane (Dr. David B.) of Sewickley and Mary Jo Hutchison (John E. Jr.) of Saxonburg. She is survived by 18 grandchildren, 2 great grand-children and numerous nieces and nephews.
