Orton (Danny) D. Duffy, formerly of Butler, died Sunday, October 25, 2009 at his home in Florida.

Born February 10, 1922 in North Washington, Butler, PA, he was the son of the late Orton and Hazel (Pennington) Duffy.

After serving in the Air Force as a Sergeant in WW II, he worked as a electrician at ARMCO Steel in Butler. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge, VFW and American Legion organizations in Butler and the Moose in Florida.
