Peter Luchkiw, 85 of Prospect, died Thursday, March 11, 2004 at 6:00 AM at his residence.

Born June 9, 1918 in Lyndora, PA, he was the son of the late Wasyl and Helen (Simchak) Luchkiw.

He worked as a coal miner for Brier Hill Coal mine, Cannel Coal mines and Wildwood Coal Mine. He was a member of Hill United Presbyterian Church. He was groundskeeper at Pullman Memorial Baseball Park from the early 50's until 1962. He also worked at 7 Up Bottling in Lyndora. He worked in Slippery Rock School District until his retirement in 1982 where he was known as Mr. Pete. He served in the United States Army during WW 2 in 337th Field Artillery Btn. in Italy.
