Robert George Blumling, 79, of Newhaven Court, formerly of West North Street, passed away Saturday February 13, 2010 at Allegheny General Hospital, ten days after suffering an abdominal aneurysm rupture.

Born October 7, 1930 in Butler, he was the son of the late Pauline Evans Blumling Lauer and Howard Blumling.

Robert was a graduate of Butler High School and attended New Mexico Western College as a member of the Armed Forces. After serving in the Korean War, he was the local U.S. Air Force Recruiting Sergeant for the Butler area. Robert retired from a career as an insurance investigator. He was a member of St. Paul's Catholic Church.

He was married to Violet Lukosky of Cabot, who passed away in 1965 at the age of 43. Robert raised their two children as a single father.
