Robert James Damico, 84, of Saxonburg, formerly of Bull Creek Road, Butler, died at 8 PM on Saturday, September 2, 2006 at Butler Memorial Hospital.

He was born Wednesday, October 5, 1921 in Charleroi, PA, the son of the late Charles Damico and the late Mary Hornick Damico.
