Ronald Guentner peacefully passed away at his home in Butler, PA on January 25, 2020 at the age of 78. He is survived by his eternally loving wife, Nancy Guentner. They were married on October 30, 1965 in Detroit, MI and were a shining example of a loving, faithful, and enduring relationship for 54 years.
