William "Bill" Saul, 65, of Baltimore, formerly of Butler, died Tuesday, September 12, 2006 after a long illness in Baltimore.

He was born Nov. 19, 1940 in Butler, the son of Craig and Ruth Saul Sr.

He was a two-sport Star at Butler High School where he graduated from in 1958. He graduated from Penn State University in 1962, where he played football and basketball. Saul was the No. 3 draft choice of the Baltimore Colts, where he played two years before being traded to the Pittsburgh Steelers, where he played middle linebacker for six seasons. He then played one year for the New Orleans Saints and one year for the Detroit Lions. He was inducted into the Butler Sports Hall of Fame in 1968.

Surviving are his ex-wife, Dorothy Blanch Saul; 2 children, Clifton Saul Sr. and Gail Klaben and her husband, Michael; and four grandchildren, Cliff Jr., Eric, Megan, and Kristy all of Baltimore.
